

TN-M ROMEOS Ride, July 21st Ken Gray

Joe Courtney and I were the only ones that showed up for the ROMEOS ride. There was a little bit of fog when I left the house, but it was mostly gone by the time I got to Lenoir City. We left the Cracker Barrel parking lot promptly at 9:00 am and headed north towards Oak Ridge. At the split, we took highway 58 over to Blair Road (TN 327). At the intersection with TN 61, we turned left and after a few miles we headed North on US 27. The temperature at this point was around 72 degrees and the skies were partly cloudy. What a great day for a ride. We stayed on US 27 North until we got to Sunbright and then took Burrville Road through Burrville until it intersected with TN 52. The traffic was really light, and it allowed us to ride at our own pace through all the fun curves. We stayed on TN 52 through Jamestown and kept going West through a bunch of uphill and downhill sweepers while taking in the very nice scenery on either side of the road. At the intersection with TN 85, we turned left and headed towards Clarkrange. The traffic was even more remote in this area, and we encountered some challenging uphill, hairpin turns, and some very steep drop offs on the side of the road. This made for some gorgeous scenery, but we couldn't enjoy it too much for fear of running off the road. When we got to Clarkrange,


