

Chapter M "Out Having FUN!"

TN-M Trip Out West

Ken Gray

First, let me say that I am proud to be the owner of a dependable Honda Goldwing. While being on the road for 17 days and riding 6860 miles through 17 states, I did not have a single issue with my motorcycle or Bushtec trailer. My Goldwing started right up each morning and I rode for an average of 400 miles per day. I didn't have to add any oil to the engine or even put air in the tires.

My goal for this ride was to go from the Mexican border to the Canadian border on US 191, a very scenic highway that starts in Douglas, AZ. It doesn't go through any large towns, but it does go near to many national parks and national monuments. It ends at the Canadian border in Morgan, MT. I took many side trips in order to visit the national parks and monuments. Since I wanted to ride the Beartooth Highway and visit Glacier National Park, I had to switch from US 191 to US 89 in Yellowstone National Park and continue my Northward trek. US 89 is also a very scenic highway. The largest town it passes through is Great Falls, MT and it ends at the Canadian Border in Babb, MT.

Basically, my route was to get on I-24 in Chattanooga and take I-24W to I-59S to I-20W to Big Spring, TX. From there it was mostly state highways to the Mexican border in Douglas, AZ and then US 191 and US 89 to the Canadian border. To get home, I took US 89S to I-15S to US 87S to I-90E to US 385S to US 2E to I-80E to I-29S to I-70E to I-64E to I-24E to I-40E and back to Kingston, TN. I rode through many remote areas where the traffic was practically non-existent and all you could see for miles and miles was wilderness. It was nice to be able to ride at my own pace and enjoy the scenery, but also a little bit scary as cell service was not available in a few of the places and if I had a breakdown, I might have to wait for up to an hour for another vehicle to pass by.

My shortest day was 150 miles, and my longest day was 710 miles. Each day's ride was different depending on what stops I was planning to make that day and what type of road I was riding on. Out West, the speed limit on the interstate highways is 80 MPH, so you can make pretty good time. Even the state highways like US 191 and US 89 have a speed limit of 70 MPH because the roads go straight as an arrow for miles and miles with very few curves. I was pleased to find that most of the roads were in good condition or in the process of being repaved. I'm glad to see that our tax dollars are being well spent on maintaining our infrastructure.

There were some roads where I was averaging only 20 MPH because there were a lot of tight switchbacks or scenic overlooks where I had to stop and take a picture. These roads were the "Beartooth Highway", "Going to the Sun Road" and the "Needles Highway".

I had no issues finding gas as there was usually a gas station every 20 to 30 miles, but there were many times where I went 50 to 70 miles between gas stations, and one time I had to go 135 miles with no services. I was being conservative and whenever my gas gauge got below ½ tank, I started looking for a gas station even though I could have gone farther. As Fran says, "When traveling in unfamiliar territory, Don't Pass Gas".

It rained a lot during my ride, just not where I was at the time. I had to put my rain suit on only three times and used it for less than an hour each time. I could see rain all around me, but most times I passed through an area just after the rain had stopped or just before it started. I did ride on a lot of wet or damp roads though.

Temperatures in the South and Southwest were in the 70's in the morning and 90's in the afternoon, but in Wyoming, Montana and South Dakota the morning temperatures were in the 40's and afternoon temps were in the 60's and 70's. The coldest temperature I saw was 39 degrees and the hottest was 103 degrees. I actually had to turn on the heat in a few of my hotel rooms and I used the seat and handgrip heaters on my bike a few days to stay warm.

I must say that America sure is beautiful. I suffered from sensory overload after looking at all the gorgeous and varied scenery as I passed through the different states and national parks.

















KY District Rally in Lawrenceburg, KY, August 19-21 Brian Richards


Loretta & I attended the KY District Rally in Lawrenceburg, KY and had a really nice time. Of special notice to us, at least, is that we were able to travel to the rally ON OUR MOTORCYCLE! Most all of you know about Loretta's issues from her broken hips and getting serious pain in her hip muscles after a period of time with her legs stretched out to straddle the motorcycle seat. With some PT and exercises, she is building up a tolerance and acceptance, and is now able to go about 45-50 minutes before it gets to be unbearable. And so far, after getting off the bike and getting her legs back straight, within 10 minutes the pain is all gone. When she insisted we could go to the rally on the bike (she's been repeatedly asking me why we go on the chapter rides, and to the rallies, in the car and not on the bike, and I explain how I don't like to put her into so much pain), I said okay since it was a relatively short distance from home to the rally, about 3 hours riding time. I planned out our route to add a rest stop about every 45 minutes, for about 10-15 minutes, and that worked fairly well, both going and coming home.

The rally was a lot of fun, Thursday evening there was a concert sponsored for the District by the Anderson County Visitor's Bureau, at a local park, with a local band playing, and several food trucks as well as a shaved ice truck. It had been advertised to the local community, so there were a lot of other people there besides us rally attendees, and we all had a fun evening, enjoying some really nice music, good food, and friends. As is usual for us at a rally, since we go to so many every year, we've met a LOT of members and the nicest thing about the

rallies is our opportunity to renew those friendships with members from other Districts that we haven't seen in a while.

I had told the District Director that we were willing to help out in any way we could, and when we arrived there he immediately informed me of a problem that he hoped I could solve – his District Educator, who had all the plans set up for a "People's Choice Bike Show", had called him the evening before informing him that he and his wife were extremely sick and couldn't come. Since I had told Rick that I was able to judge bike shows, among other things, he asked if I would be willing and able to take over the function of the bike show, and of course I agreed. It worked out really well, we had voting slips that we gave one to each member that came out to check out the bikes, and we had a number on each bike's headlight, for them to mark on their ballot. Of special thrill to us was our bike won in the "Custom 2-wheeled" class. Yippee!

We enjoyed ourselves quite a bit, so we definitely plan on going again next year, which is planned to be at the same location, which was an American Legion Post.




