TN-M Labor Day Weekend trip down Natchez Trace Brian Richards

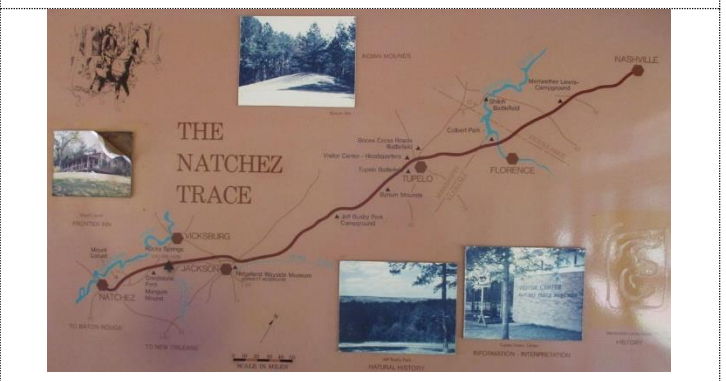

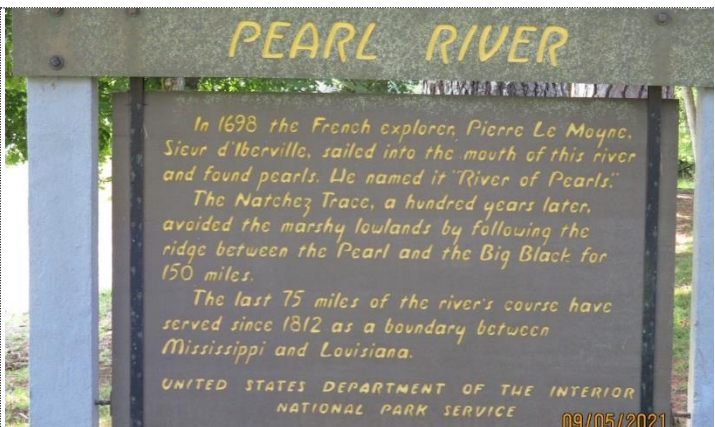

We had a special occurrence, I won't call them "guests", but chapter TN-M members from quite some time ago, that had moved to Florida, Rick & Linda Collins, have returned to Tennessee, and they joined us, and I heard a lot of "catch-up" conversation going on at the other end of the table between them and some other long time chapter members, which was nice. We're glad to see them back and hope to see them at many more chapter activities in the future.

100,000 Miles **Russ Wools**

Well, this story really started back in October of 2012 when I transitioned from sport bikes to my new 2012, GL-1800. From day one of owning the wing, I knew I wanted to travel and put lots of miles on the bike; that I referred to as my couch. I planned for 3 years to ride it to Alaska and back; a mere 11,771-mile round trip in 2015. My planning included my first trip of 6,600 miles to Wing Ding in Madison, WI, in 2014. All was progressing well for reaching 100,000 miles on that bike until the fateful day, May 31, 2017, out in Colorado. I scratched my bike at 85,282 miles. Well scratched is putting it mildly. She was considered totaled by the insurance company. So, after a very painful month, both physically and mentally, I got my 2017 GL-1800 on July 6, 2017. Thus, the goal of putting as many miles on my bike as I could, restarted. I rode a small 6,000-mile round trip to Maine in 2018. I resumed the trip that I had my accident on in 2019. 2020 being the most challenging year due to Covid, I managed to put more than 19,000 miles on the bike just in east TN. My new wing has seen both oceans and a large majority of the states again. I have ridden to the last 3 states needed to complete seeing all 50 states; 49 have been on a wing. Hawaii being the only state that I have been to that I have not rode on a Goldwing. I have visited more than 25 National parks during my travels. I have taken more than 20,000 pictures and videos of the places visited. It seems only fitting to travel home to Indiana to visit my family to finally reach 100,000 miles on a single motorcycle. I set up my trip odometer at 98,999.5 miles so I could get the picture with all 9's showing. Then I eased forward the half mile to get 100,000 miles in Martinsville, IN. It only took 4 years, 1 month and 21 days to reach 100,000 miles. As one friend commented on my Facebook post of the pictures; "only 900,000 miles to go". That is 185,000 miles on Goldwing's since 2012 and with 103,000 miles on sport bikes previously, that makes 288,000 miles since 1993 on the road on 2 wheels and many more to go.

Take a close look at both photos of the odometer below, the first one with some detailed prior planning on my part, got to be 99,999 miles on the odometer and 999.9 on the trip odometer. Then the second photo shows the 100,000 miles on the odometer and 0.0 miles on the trip odometer.

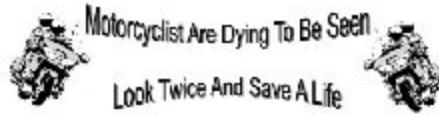
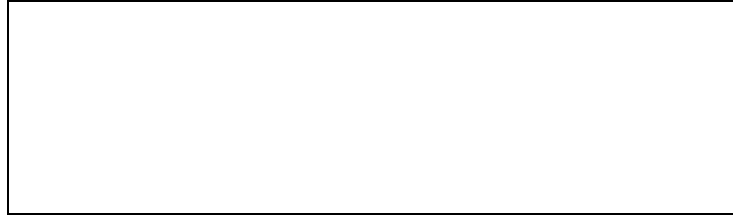
