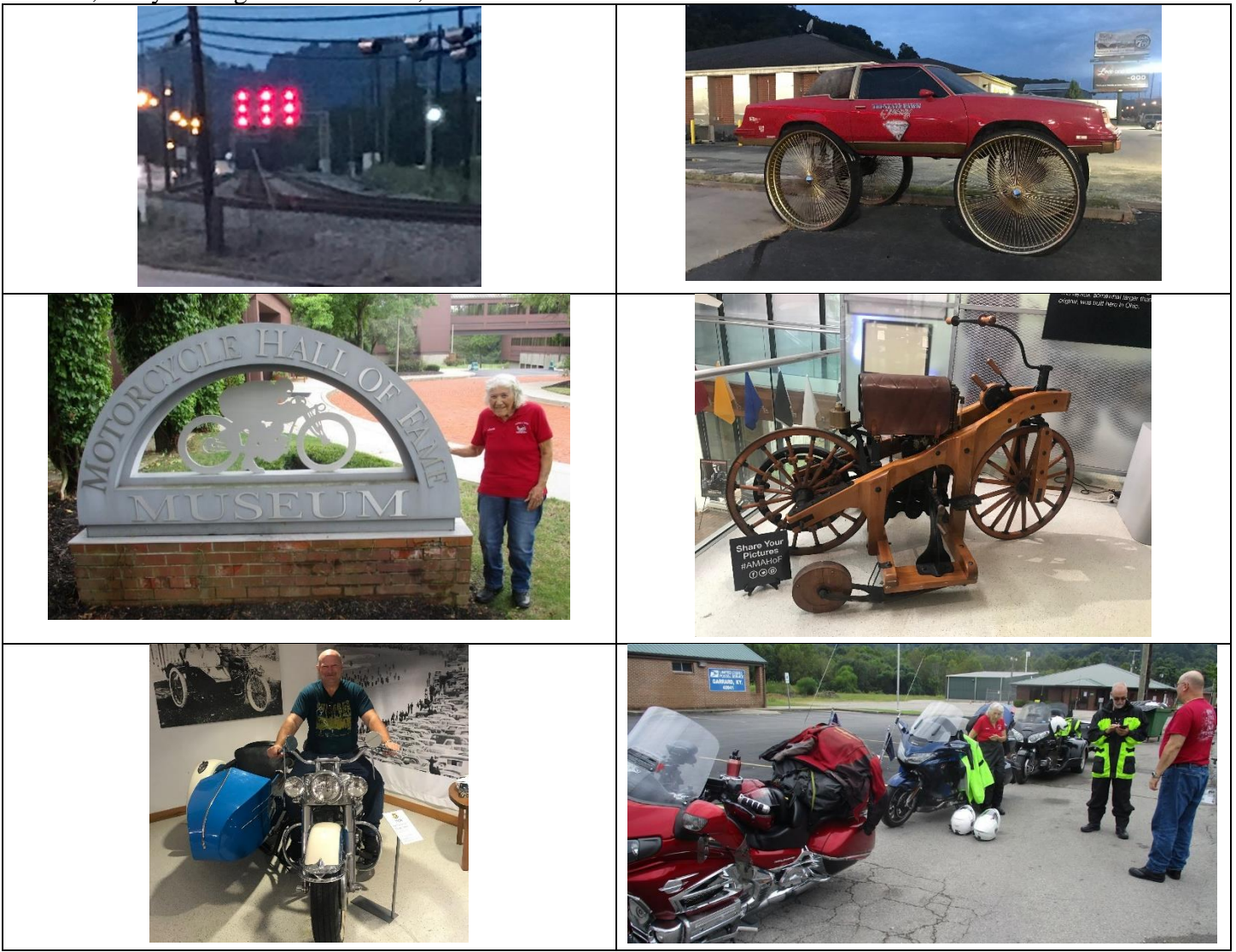
Chapter M "Out Having FUN!"

**TNM Ride OH-555 & AMA Museum, September 3-5

Mel, Renee, Brian, Loretta and I headed out from the Cracker Barrel on 9/3/22 to head up to Ohio to ride OH-555. There was a light rain that lasted about the first four hours of the ride. We stopped for lunch after passing through the tunnel into Middlesboro, KY at Dairy Queen. I was the only one to have ice cream with my meal. About an hour after lunch, I was able to take off the rain suit. It did sprinkle a bit more, but it felt good due to the

heat from being suited up so long. We stayed to back roads mainly with a couple of GPS programming issues leading us astray down a dead end and then down a road that turned to gravel. We made it to the stopping point for the first day and had supper at Applebee's. We headed to the hotel after supper and were greeted with our every 20-30-minute alarm clock. The hotel is next to a very busy set of 3 railroad tracks. Trains did seem to pass every 20-30 minutes, blowing their horns at the crossings. The next morning, we were greeted with a light rain again for the first couple of hours. After breakfast at Bob Evans, we made our way over to the start of OH-555. Thankfully the rain had stopped before we hit 555. We had a very spirited ride up OH-555. It has many turns and hills that just seem to drop out from under you like a roller coaster. Quite fun! After a snack at a rest stop, we finished OH-555 and headed to the AMA museum. Not knowing what to expect at the museum, it was very nice. Lots of history and many different styles of motorcycles, even a few you were allowed to touch or sit on. The only downside is we didn't arrive there until ~1600 so we only got 1 hour in the museum. We then headed for supper near Columbus, OH, at Hickory House restaurant. Great food but took a while for us to get seated. We then made it to the hotel just before the rain started again. Monday morning, we could have used a boat. It was pouring cats and dogs most of the morning. We had breakfast at Bob Evans in Columbus. We kept to back roads the first part of the day thinking that we would miss some of the holiday traffic on I-75. We stopped for lunch in Paris, KY at Jerry's place. A very busy place with good food. If it weren't for the rain, there were a lot of old cars next door that would have been nice to look closer at. We hit I-75 south for the remainder of the ride. We stopped for gas in Williamsburg, KY. Across the street from the station was a Dairy Queen, so we made an ice cream pit stop as well. The rain stopped for the day thankfully near London, KY and stayed away until reaching home. Thanks to Ken Grey for planning the majority of this ride.

In all, 3 days riding over 950 miles, door to door.



TNM ROMEOS Ride, September 21st

It was a beautiful, sunny day. When I arrived at the Cracker Barrel the temperature was in the upper-sixties. Joe was already there. Nobody else showed up. We had a brief rider's meeting at 9:20 and started putting on our riding gear around 9:25. At 9:30, we were sitting at the stop light at the intersection with Highway 321. I was disappointed about making a couple of wrong turns on last month's ride, so I decided to redeem myself by choosing the same initial route as last month, but with a larger loop to prolong the ride and enjoy the nice weather. We rode past Lenoir City High School to Sugar Limb Road. Then down I-75 to the exit for highway 72 at Loudon. We took Highway 72 past Paint Rock, then left on Dogtown Road to Ponders Gap Road. After a few miles we turned right on Ten Mile Road. This is where I messed up last month, because I turned right before reaching Ten Mile Road and ended up back in Kingston. No wrong turns this time. We took Ten Mile Road over to Highway 304 and then down to Highway 68. We crossed over Watts Bar Dam and then took Highway 302 down to Dayton. In Dayton we got on Highway 30 and took that over the plateau to Sequatchie Valley. We stopped for a restroom break at the Exxon station in Pikeville. The temperature was in the upper seventies by now, so time to open the vent on my windshield. My Stomach told me it was lunchtime, but since we were in Central Time Zone it was only 10:30 a.m. I ate a Neapolitan flavored ice cream sandwich at the gas station and we mounted up to continue our ride on Highway 30. There were a lot of fun switchbacks and sharp curves as we rode up the mountain out of Sequatchie Valley. We rode past the entrance to Fall Creek Falls State Park enjoying the fun curves and elevation changes, then took Highway 285 over to Highway 111. We enjoyed more fun curves and beautiful scenery with hardly any traffic in sight. From Highway 111, we took Highway 70S into Sparta. It was now 11:30 Central Time, so we stopped for lunch at Yanni's Grill. They offered American, Greek and Italian fare. I ordered a meatball sandwich and Joe ordered a Gyro. After a great lunch we headed east on Highway 70 for about a mile and then turned left on Highway 84. We took that to Monterey while enjoying more fun curves, awesome scenery and no traffic. In Monterey, we took Highway 70N to Crossville. While eating lunch, Joe and I decided we would stop at the new Bucee's when we got to Crossville. It was amazing. They had everything you would ever want while traveling. The restrooms were very large with many, many stalls and very clean. It appeared that one or two employees were assigned specifically to keep the restroom clean during their shift. By now the temperature was in the mid-eighties. We took Highway 70 back to Kingston, stopping at the Weigel's gas station in Mid Town. It was now close to ninety degrees. After topping off our gas tanks, Joe decided to take Highway 61 back to Clinton. I continued on Highway 70 back to my house. I got home around 4:15 p.m. For me, the ride was 236 miles, driveway to driveway.

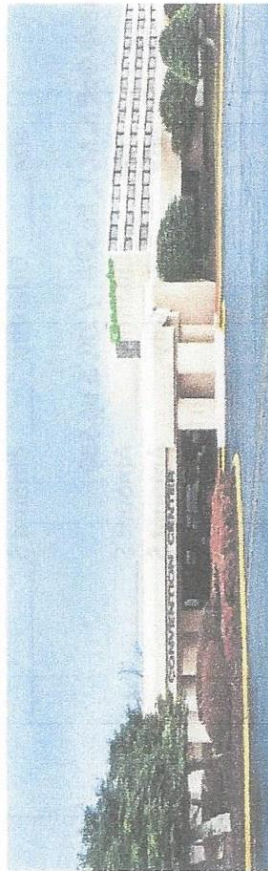

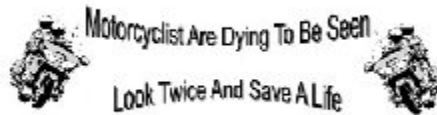
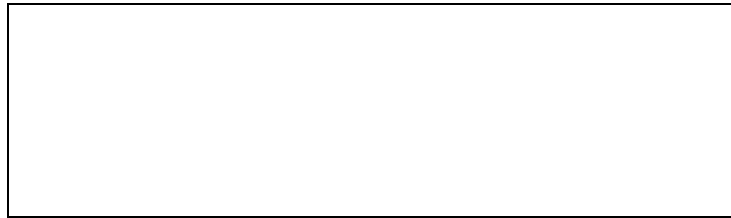
