

Chapter M "Out Having FUN!" TNM ROMEOS Ride, October 19th Ken Gray

I wanted to test my winter riding gear before the winter riding season started and today was a perfect opportunity to do that. It was 34 degrees when I left my house this morning. I arrived at the Cracker Barrel around 9:10 a.m. Joe and Butch were already there. We had a brief rider's meeting at 9:15. No one else showed up and I wasn't expecting any more people to participate so we mounted up around 9:20 a.m. and got the wheels turning. It was about 38 degrees when we left the Cracker Barrel, and the sun was shining. That helped to take the chill off. We took 321 down past Fort Loudon Dam and then Hwy 95 toward Greenback. We cut over to East Tellico Parkway and then took 411 South to Vonore. In Vonore, we took 360 South to Tellico Plains. We stopped for a break at the Tellico Plains Visitor Center. It was way too cold to attempt a ride on the Cherohala Skyway today, so after a short break we took Highways 39 and 315 to Reliance. My winter riding gear was

keeping me warm and toasty except for a few brief moments when riding in the shade. The sun does wonders for keeping a body warm. There were a lot of Fall colors on the trees, but not as vibrant as in years past. I think the dry weather we had the past several weeks kept the colors at bay. In Reliance we took Hwy 30 over to Etowah. The temperature was in the mid-forties by now and it was around 11:30 a.m. so, we stopped for lunch at Jessica's Place on Hwy 411 in Etowah. After a nice lunch we continued North on 411 to Englewood. The temperature was now in the low fifties, and we were enjoying the scenery and light traffic. We took 30 West over to Athens and then 307 North past the Mayfield Dairy plant up to the Lost Sea on Hwy 68. Then we took 68 West to Sweetwater and 11 North to Lenoir City. We stopped at the Weigel's gas station at Eaton's Crossroads to split up and go home from there. I got home around 2:30 p.m. and for me, the ride was about 163 miles, driveway to driveway. We had beautiful weather all day and my winter riding gear did it's job to keep me warm. I had a great time riding with my Chapter M friends.

TNM Ride to Carver's Apple Archard, Oct 22nd Brian Richards

It was a cool start for our ride, around 44 degrees, but those that showed up were dressed for it, layered and/or heated gear, so we were all set. To start out we had a good group, and lots of laughs and camaraderie standing around to make sure everyone that was going, got there for our 9am start. We started with 11 members, and knew that we were going to be joined by Burl along the way, so 12 members in 5 motorcycles, 2 Trikes and one car, we made for a nice group.

The day warmed up nicely for us, and we had a really nice ride to Carvers, even though we had some unforeseen issues with detours and detours of the detour, but eventually we make it to Carvers, then was the interesting challenge of finding parking spaces, with the fall colors out for people to enjoy, and nice, sunny day to take advantage of, there were a whole lot of people out, and it seemed a bunch of them had the same idea as us of visiting Carvers. Oh well. Some of us made some purchases at the store (I was disappointed, they had run out of fresh apple cider, darn) while waiting to be called to go into the dining room for lunch. Eventually they called for us, and in we trouped, and they were able to fit the 12 of us at three tables for four all next to each other, which was nice.

After a pleasant lunch, it was back on the road, to get into the start of Pigeon Forge (boy was the road crowded) to get to "Cruze Farm" store for ... what else ... ice cream. After the ice cream, it was back on the road quickly getting off the main drag onto the back roads, and on our way home. As we each reached the best spot to turn off from the group to go our separate way to get home, we separated. But all told it was a very nice day.

TNM Ride on Ohio Route 555 Ken Gray


I had mapped out a 3-day ride for Chapter M to include the Ohio Triple Nickel scenic byway and a stop at the AMA Hall of Fame Museum near Columbus, Ohio. When Chapter M decided to do this ride, my wife, Chris and I were not able to participate due to work and personal commitments. When Chapter M returned from the ride, they told me about my interesting choice for the motel in Ashland, Ky. I was not aware that it was located near three railroad tracks and that a train rolled through about every 30 minutes all night long. When Chris and I had enough free time, we decided to do a Fall Colors ride using this route. But first, I made some modifications to the route because Chris and I had already been to the AMA Hall of Fame Museum and we wanted to spend the night in Lexington, Kentucky so we could spend some quality time with our daughter and grandchildren. I decided to spend the first night in Gallipolis, Ohio instead of Ashland, Kentucky. This added about 45 miles to itinerary for day 1, but it got us away from the three railroad tracks and it reduced the number of miles we would have to ride on day 2.

Day 1 - We had to drop our dog off at the kennel before we could leave town, so it was about 8:45 am before we got the wheels turning. The temperature was about 43 degrees when we left with an expected high temperature of 77 in the afternoon. We headed east through Oak Ridge and Clinton taking route 61 past Big Ridge State Park, then route 170 over to route 33. There were lots of fun curves and great scenery along this section. We headed


north on route 33 through Maynardville and Tazewell, continuing on route 25E through Harrogate. We rode through the tunnel at Cumberland Gap, crossing into Kentucky and stopped at the Cumberland Gap National Park for a restroom break and to remove a layer because the temperature was in the low 60's at this point. After a short break we continued going north on route 25E through Middlesboro and Pineville. In Barbourville we took route 11 over to route 421. It was close to noon at this point, so we stopped to fill the gas tank and then went to Wendy's for lunch. The temperature was in the mid-seventies after lunch, so off came another layer before we got back on the bike. We headed east on the Hal Rogers Parkway. It is a scenic byway and we both enjoyed the wonderful views and the clear blue skies. The Fall colors were just slightly past the peak, but we were still able to see a mixture of colors. At the end of the Hal Rogers Parkway, we merged onto route 80 continuing east and then headed north on route 23. Traffic was light and we were making pretty good time. In Catlettsburg we got on I-64 briefly to route 52, crossing over the Ohio river into Ohio and then picking up route 7. This is another scenic byway that runs next to the Ohio river. In Gallipolis, Ohio we stopped at the Quality Inn for the night. We ended up riding non-stop from the Wendy's to the Quality Inn, a distance of 209 miles. My low fuel light came on just as we pulled into the Quality Inn parking lot. We literally rode tank to tank that afternoon. As luck would have it, there was a gas station right next to the motel. A fitting end to a perfect day of riding. We had clear blue skies all day long. Total distance for the day was 347 miles.

Day 2 - We got the wheels turning around 7:35 am. Again, the temperature was in the low 40's with an expected high temperature of 78 for that afternoon. We continued north on route 7 to route 555, the Triple Nickel. We took the Triple Nickel Scenic Byway up to Zanesville, Ohio, a distance of about 70 miles. Average speed was about 35 mph because it was just one curve after another with many elevation changes to boot. It was so much fun. I will definitely want to do this ride again. In Zanesville we made a quick stop to remove a layer and then got on Route 22 heading west. The clear blue skies from the previous day gave way to cloudy skies. In Circleville we stopped for lunch at a local diner and then topped off the gas tank before continuing on 22 West. In Washington Court House we got on route 62 heading southwest. The cloudy skies of the morning morphed into dark, ominous looking clouds in the afternoon and the wind was blowing a little harder, but the temperature was in the mid-seventies, and we could not see any rain on the horizon. In Aberdeen we crossed over the Ohio river back into Kentucky and then got on route 11 to Mt. Sterling. Our daughter is a manager at WasteQuip in Mt. Sterling, so we stopped at the plant, and she gave us a brief tour. After an impressive tour of the plant, we took I-64 West to Lexington and checked in to our motel for the night. I had not been to our daughter's house since she moved to Lexington about a year ago, so we went over to her house for a quick tour and to visit with the grandchildren. The low fuel light came on as we were heading back to the motel, but no worries, there was a gas station next to the motel. We met our daughter and grandchildren at the Outback Steakhouse after walking over from the motel and spent some more quality time with them. It started raining while we were eating dinner, so we had to walk back to the motel in the rain. We didn't mind getting wet because we were just thankful that we didn't have to ride in it after seeing dark, ominous clouds all afternoon. We had a very nice visit with our family. Total distance for the day was about 368 miles.

Day 3 - It had stopped raining during the night, and it was 52 degrees in the morning but the weather forecast was saying the temperature was not going to change very much. It was windy, damp and dreary when we left the motel. We filled the tank at the gas station next door and headed down the road around 8:00 am. We went west on Man-O-War Boulevard for about 8 miles and then turned left onto 27 South. About 50 miles south of Lexington the temperature dropped down to 48 degrees, where it stayed for the next hundred miles. Around 10:00 am, Chris and I stopped to put on another layer as we both were getting chilled. It was cold, windy, damp and dreary with an occasional very light drizzle most of the way. Quite a bit different from the mid seventy-degree temperatures of the previous two days. We stayed on 27 South all the way to Harriman, Tennessee. Then we took 62 East to route 327 to route 58 and back home. Just south of Wartburg the temperature started rising again and by the time we got home it was 55 degrees and partly cloudy. Total distance for the day was around 196 miles. We enjoyed getting to see some Fall colors and other great scenery on the back roads of Kentucky and Ohio. Traffic was light most of the way and made for a very pleasant ride. Cumulative total for the three-day ride was 911 miles.







TNM KY Ferry ride, Oct 22nd Russ Wools

I rode my modified Standing Stone State Park ride on 10/1/22. Nobody joined probably due to the weather. Randy and I went on a ride Sunday. To avoid directly repeating the ride I did the day before, I suggested we ride up the ferry in KY that Ken Grey recommended. We left from Kingston Elementary School. We rode up Swan Pond road to Harriman, up Hwy 27 to TN 52. We then rode up Hwy 127 to TN 295. While riding up 127 a deer tried to catch a ride with me. Thankfully, I missed him by 3 feet! We ate lunch at Sunset Marina after killing the hour that I failed to account for due to the time zone change. We headed back up Hwy 111/Hwy 127 to Albany, KY. We took KY 90, to 61 and then KY 953, where the rode narrowed down to less than 1.5 lanes wide. It only had white lines on the edges; no center line. We then turned onto KY 214. It was even narrower I believe; but it did have a center line, no white lines though. We crested the hill and arrived at the ferry. After about 5 mins, the ferry pulled up to our side of the river. We were off on our very long 4-min ferry ride. Since we were on very narrow roads before the ferry, I decided to try another one. We took it over to KY 163, south of Thompkinsville, KY. We hit TN-51 at the TN-KY border. We then took TN-52 down to Standing Stone State Park. We stopped and fed the fish, crackers, for a few minutes. We continued across the single lane over the Dam at the park. We took TN-84 to Monterey, TN, where we stopped at Dairy Queen. We then took TN-62 back to Oak Ridge where we split up. A great 9 hour day, over 275 miles, for a 4-min ferry ride.




