

Chapter M "Out Having FUN!"

TNM Ride, Big South Fork State Park ride, Aug 12th Russ Wools

Saturday, 8-12-23, the ride to Big South Fork State Park for a picnic was interesting to say the least! We headed out from Cracker Barrel as usual. Frank, Sandra, from TN-A2, Randy, Marlene, Mel, Renee, Joe, and Butch joined me for the ride. We headed up 321 over to Blair rd. to Poplar Creek. We then headed up 330 to 116 to Rocky Top, TN. We took old TN 63 to TN 63 over to rte. 456 to Oneida, TN. Finally taking rte. 297 to Big South Fork State Park. We took a short walk down to the East Rim Overlook. It was a bit overcast at that point but still quite a view. We decided to use the picnic table located next to the parking lot to have our picnic lunch. After lunch we continued for a short ride to Leatherwood Ford to look at the Big South Fork Cumberland River. We walked along the river to the old bridge. As we were walking back to the bikes, it started to sprinkle, a sign of things to come. We rode out of the rain after about 5 minutes heading to Jamestown, TN for Dairy Queen. While at DQ we were checking out the weather radar. It was not looking too good if we continued west on TN-52 to TN 85. The radar looked fairly clear if we were to head east and head for home. So, we headed east on TN-52 toward Elgin, TN. After about 15 miles in the clouds turned nasty dark, lightning striking just to the south of the road. Then the sprinkles turned to rain. We turned into a picnic area that I was hoping had a shelter; no such luck. We donned our rain gear, at least those who had some and continued toward Elgin. A few miles later the rain turned into a torrential downpour. We even passed a few bikers that were huddled on a small porch of a small market. There really wasn't any place for us to take shelter until I caught sight of a medical facility that had just enough cover for all of the bikes. We made a quick U-turn and pulled in under the shelter at Highland Health Center. It was a welcome relief as visibility had decreased to only a few feet. It sheltered us from most of the rain but not all of it. We kept checking the radar. There seemed to be a gap in the storms to make it to at least Wartburg. So we headed back out in just a light sprinkle. About ½ mile later we caught sight of some of the storm damage. A tree was down on HWY 27 just north of TN-52 and had traffic backed up heading north. Thankfully we were turning south. A short time later some of the massive amount of rainfall was rushing over the road about 4-6" deep along with several limbs down in the road partially. As we approached Wartburg, the rain picked back up and visibility again dropped to a few feet. I spotted a bank teller area that we could pull over and take shelter again. The parking lot probably had 3-5" of water in it by the time the rain let up some. Again, after spotting a gap in the weather on the radar, we headed down TN-62 toward Oliver Springs. Once in Oliver Springs we split up to make the final run for home. We all made it home safe. Some more wet than others. I was quite wet from the waist up and dry below. We only completed about ½ of the original ride, but it would have been much worse had we pressed on west from Jamestown based on all the storms that rapidly built all around us.



TNM ROMEOS Ride, August 16th Ken Gray

The weather forecast for Wednesday was perfect for motorcycle riding with morning temperatures in the sixties and afternoon temperatures around 80 degrees with only a 10% chance of rain. The bike I had chosen to ride stalled while the engine was warming up and I could not get it restarted. So, I had to pull another bike out of my garage. It started easily and I was on my may just a few minutes later than I had planned. I arrived at the Cracker Barrel around 8:45 a.m. and Butch was already there. No one else showed up, so we had a brief rider's meeting and got on our way. I had picked the route on Monday morning to go to Ducktown by way of Tellico Plains on Highway 68. That was before the heavy thunderstorms passed through Tellico Plains on Monday evening and caused major flooding in the area. We decided to stick to the original route and if we encountered flooded or washed-out roads, we would just turn around and go somewhere else. It turned out to not be a problem. The flood waters had receded by the time we got there. We could see evidence of the flooding because the grass about 6 feet up from the drainage ditches was bent over from the water rushing through, but since Highway 68 is slightly elevated in that area, there was no water anywhere and we got through that area just fine. The biggest problem was around Madisonville because the highway department had one lane closed for a repaving project. In Ducktown we stopped for gas and a restroom break and then headed west on Highway 64 past the area where they had the whitewater kayaking events on the Ocoee River during the Atlanta Summer Olympics. Then we took Highway 30 through Reliance and on over to Highway 411 in Delano. There was a lot of beautiful scenery and fun curves from Tellico Plains until we arrived in Delano. We stopped for lunch at Jessica's Place and then headed home from there by going north on 411, 305 and 11 to Lenoir City where we split up. I went north to Kingston and Butch went south towards Tellico Village. It was a great ride. For me, it was approximately 195 miles, driveway to driveway. After I got home, I spent three hours picking up debris from Monday's storm and mowing grass that had gotten very tall and thick from all the rain we had in the past week.






