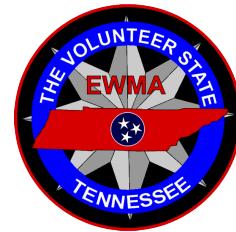

Chapter M “Out Having FUN!”

Ride to EWMA Rendezvous, Green Bay, WI, August Russ Wools

My ride to Rendezvous 2024 started a week before. I left on Thursday, Aug. 22. I headed up US-27 into Kentucky. I found a few interesting side roads that were only a little over a car width in size to get over to KY-90. My first stop of the trip was Cumberland Falls. It was very cool. There is a rainbow that forms from the mist of the falls. The sign there says they call it a moonbow. After the falls, I found US-25W. Continuing north up to KY-30 and KY-11. The second stop was at Sky Bridge Arch. To get to the Arch, I rode through Nada Tunnel. This tunnel was originally a train tunnel. It is now a single lane road. The signs says ‘yield to oncoming traffic’. The arch is a natural arch. I hiked the ¾ mile trail that walks over the arch then returns below it back the parking lot. There were quite a few steps to climb to get back to the upper trail. After the arch, I rode over to Versailles, KY. There I rode an electric assist pedal car on the rails owned by Rail Explorers. The ride left from the Bluegrass Scenic Railroad and Museum and followed on the rails out to an abandoned trestle; then back. I have ridden numerous scenic railroads but never like this. After the very enjoyable ride on the rails, I headed up to Seymour, IN, via Madison, IN.

Friday, I went to the Seymour visitors center. This happens to be an old train freight station. They had some very interesting history about the rail traffic and robberies that happen on them. There was also a display on John Mellencamp, famous rock star from Seymour. The rest of the day I visited with my mom in Martinsville, IN. Saturday, I headed to Anderson, IN for a family reunion from my dad’s side of the family. I got to see my dad, sister, aunt and many cousins.

The week before leaving, I was helping Randy Kinney with his bike. He asked if I minded if he joined me on my trip. So, he rode up and met me at one of my favorite restaurants in Anderson after my reunion, Saturday evening. We ate supper before heading out. We headed west for a stop in Champaign, IL for the night. That made for a very long day for Randy, especially with the hour time zone change. Sunday morning, we continued west to Fort Madison, IA. Things went a bit awry though. The only bridge that I even wanted to cross on the whole trip, was the bridge on IL-9, at Fort Madison. It was closed for maintenance. Therefore, we ended up on a 50-mile detour south to the next bridge then back up to Fort Madison. We stopped at Riverview Park to see the Mississippi River, old fort remnants and trains. Have you caught on to the theme of this trip yet? In a little over an hour and a half we saw 10 plus trains. One of the routes I planned had us go down the road over the rail yard. This bridge had a wood plank approach and asphalt deck. It probably should be condemned. Thankfully the wings and trailers were lighter than cars. From there we were heading to Ames, IA. At an intersection in West Point, IA, I spotted a Freedom Rock out of the corner of my eye. We made a small detour to pull up near it to get some photos of it. I first heard of the Freedom Rocks out in Colorado at the Ride-in back in June. There is one in every county in IA, and each has a different mural painted on them. After a long day’s ride, we reached Ames for the evening.

Monday morning, we headed to Boone, IA. I had Randy a bit off the rails at this point. We rode down some gravel roads, under a large railroad bridge, Kay Shelley High Bridge. To my surprise the bridge had a newer one built beside it. The old one is a metal trestle. The new one has concrete pillars. After the off-road excursion to the bridge, we headed back into Boone. There was another Freedom Rock located there. We stopped at the rock for some photos before heading over to the train museum. We rode the Rail Explorer in Boone out over a couple of bridges that provided awesome scenic views. Unfortunately, the train museum itself was closed that day. We then headed over to Iowa Falls to stop at the veteran’s memorial, a carved Indian statue and a swinging bridge. The next stop from here was in Mankato, MN. The only problem was, there was another detour that we encountered. This added about 10 miles to the detour we were already on to get gas. We made it to Minneopa State Park in Mankato. The park has a nice waterfall and trails. The trails that I had planned to hike, however, were closed due to storm damage back in June. We rode over to the bison area; another part of the park, to see

them. But the clouds looked like we were going to get some serious storms, so we high-tailed it over to our hotel. Thankfully we did not get any of the severe weather.

Tuesday, we headed up to Minneapolis. We walked around all the levels of Mall of America. I had a couple of different stops in Minneapolis, but they turned out to be closed that day. So, I just punched into the GPS an area I thought was a park, to view the river. It turned out to be an industrial area, that we could not see the river at all. We did find a hole in the wall restaurant nearby, that had good food. We then headed to Eau Claire, WI. We stopped at the Chippewa Valley Museum. In my planning, I thought this was an Indian museum. It was a museum of the county/area. There was lots of historical information, including motorboat outboard motors made at the local factory. There was a very neat train looking machine that had tracks vice wheels, like a bulldozer. This was used to move large sleds used by logging companies to move logs and large equipment.

Wednesday, we rode down along the Mississippi River to La Crosse, WI. From there we rode over to the Mid-Continent Railway Museum in North Freedom, WI. We got to do something I have never done. We rode the caboose on the scenic train ride. They are incredibly talented at the restoration process there. There were several cars restored that were absolutely impeccable! Next stop was finally Green Bay. Randy and I ran into Brian while we were trying to get settled into our rooms and find parking.

Thursday, Rendezvous started. Randy mentioned someone told him about a sandwich they had at Jackson Harbor Soup, on Washington Island. Being an island, we would have to take a ferry to get there. Another thing that I had planned on doing was riding the Costal byway. This is a zig-zag road that I had seen online and was just going to ride up that way just for that road. The island killed two birds with one stone. We made it to the ferry after the byway. The ferry ride was 30 mins each way. The sandwich shop was very popular as there were no less than 15 people in line ahead of us. After lunch we took a quick trip around the island back to the ferry. We just made the ferry, otherwise, we would have to wait 30 mins for the next one. We made it back to Green Bay 45 mins before the evening meal. Friday, Randy joined me on what was to be a museum day. First was the National Railroad Museum. We toured the museum and rode the train around the grounds. Next was the Automobile Gallery. The cars there were incredible. This was the last day Randy joined me as he was heading out around Mackinaw Bridge to visit his family in MI. Saturday, I rode one of the self-guided rides to Primal Eats in Gillette, WI.

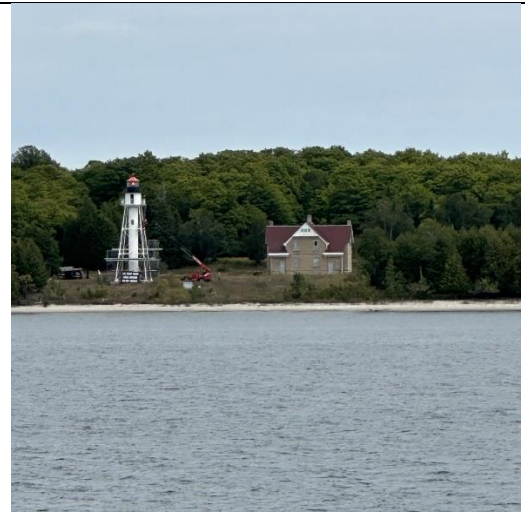
Sunday, after Rendezvous was concluded, I made a speed run from Green Bay, through Chicago and Cleveland to Salamanca, NY. Traffic in was light thankfully due to being Sunday. Monday was from Salamanca to Binghamton, Albany, Concord, NH and finally Dayton, ME to see my girlfriend, Giselle.

Giselle had plenty of things for us to do in MN and NH. Tuesday, we went to a narrow-gauge train museum in Boothbay, ME, where several buildings were relocated there along with lots of narrow-gauge trains and an automobile museum. Wednesday, we went to Lost River Gorge and Boulder Caves in Woodstock, NH. The park had approximately 11 little caves/crevices to crawl around and through along with trails to hike through. I went through all but one. Giselle's elbow kept her from doing that many. Two of the caves I ended up squeezing through on my back. We also went to a zoo and Nubble Lighthouse in York, ME. I had to suffer though. I only rode the bike about 60 miles with her. The rest of the time we rode in her convertible corvette. She even let me drive it.

Friday, I did a speed run to Davis, WV. Saturday morning it was raining a bit. I had ~2 hrs. of riding to get to Cass, WV to ride the train. On the way 4 deer walked out in front of me. One of which did a pure Bambi and went spread eagle on the road. That actually was a good thing. His head was on the ground when I hit him. It then spun around on my highway peg. I pulled over expecting my trip to be done, but all that I could see was a bent lever on the highway peg. Later I found a baseball size dent in the muffler cover on the left side. I was very lucky!!! The dead deer was not so lucky!

After the train ride in Cass, I ended up riding through Bluefield, VA and Tazewell, VA to ride the Back of the Dragon. Two more deer ran out during this leg of the trip. I spent the night in Glade Springs, VA before heading back to TN on Sunday Morning.

In all I covered 5,285 miles, over 18 days of vacation.
