

There was no planned ride to dinner, so Butch and I decided to come up with our own ride. We met at the Weigel's in Lenoir City around 3:00 pm. The high temperature that afternoon was supposed to be around 93 degrees, so we made sure to pack some ice water and plan a couple of hydration stops for the two-hour ride. We took route 321 through Maryville and on to Townsend. With all the asphalt and concrete in Maryville absorbing the sun's heat, the temperature was 94 degrees. We really felt it at the stop lights. In Townsend, we stopped at the Visitor's Center and went inside to get out of the sun and enjoy some air conditioning. We picked up some brochures for future tourist stops and used the facilities. The building had a covered front porch with rocking chairs, so we sat on the front porch and drank some ice water for a few minutes before heading on down the road. We continued on route 321 to Wears Valley and then got on the Foothills Parkway. After climbing in elevation for a little bit the temperature dropped down to a pleasant 88 degrees. Also, there was a good bit of shade on the Parkway making for a very enjoyable ride with fun curves and beautiful scenery. Most of the traffic seemed to be going the other way, so we had our lane all to ourselves and were able to ride at a decent pace. We saw more motorcycles than cars on the Parkway. After a few miles, we stopped at a scenic overlook, parked in the shade and drank some more ice water. We continued on the Parkway almost to the Look Rock overlook where we turned onto Butterfly Gap Road and then took Flats Road down to Happy Valley Road. We rode down the mountain through Montvale where there were several hairpin turns, but they were downhill, so not too difficult. We turned left on route 336 and after a few miles we turned onto Coning Road, then took Carpenters Campground Road over to Mint Road. At the intersection with Niles Ferry Road, we turned right and arrived at TC's Grill around 5:40 p.m. Eleven people showed up for dinner. We had good conversations and great food. Everybody had a good time. Vida decided that George will pick Calhoun's at the Lenoir City marina for next month's dinner ride.



Chapter ROMEOS Ride, September 18th Ken Gray

I arrived at the Cracker Barrel around 8:45 a.m. Butch was already there and no one else showed up. Butch and I left at 9:00 a.m. and took highway 70 through Kingston and Rockwood. In Crossville we turned on route 392 and then 127 to the Cumberland Mountain State Park. We took a restroom break at the park and toured the little Civilian Conservation Corp (CCC) museum. The CCC was a federal Depression Era Program that helped to get the economy going again by providing jobs to the many unemployed people and veterans. They built many of the structures in our state and national parks along with roads and bridges. After that short little break, we took highway 101, then 285 to highway 30. This is the road that goes past the entrance to Fall Creek Falls State Park. The Temperature was around 72 degrees and there were many dark clouds, but no rain in sight. I was constantly having to flip my sun visor up and down as we rode between the clouds. The traffic was light and there were many fun curves. We ended up on highway 111 and took that to Sparta where we had lunch at Yanni's Grille. I have eaten there many times and have not been disappointed. 

We stopped for lunch at Dan's Grill in Blairsville, GA. Dan's Grill is a Cuban style restaurant and the food was outstanding. After lunch we continued south on US-19 to GA-180 over to Brasstown Bald. We got a bit concerned when we arrived as we were about 10 back in line. But once through the pay booth portal, we found the parking lot only about 1/3 full or less. We then stopped for ice cream at Rocky's in Greenback, TN. This is where we ran into most of chapter A-2. We split up after our very delicious ice cream. A very good day again, with great weather. From Cracker Barrel to Rocky's was ~250 miles.






